The aforementioned issues will constitute the discussion framework for the joint conference of the Centre for High Performance Computing (CHPC) and BELIEF II project, which will be held in **Johannesburg, South Africa, from the 7th to the 9th of December 2009**. The event is aimed at advancing research collaboration and competitiveness through an integrated South African national cyber-infrastructure. Furthermore, keynote research and application results utilising the cyber-infrastructure will be illustrated, and the latest international developments will also be discussed.
